AMD ANNOUNCEMENT

The recent announcement by Advanced Micro Devices of their intent to locate in Malta is not just luck. Over thirty years ago the Saratoga Economic Development Corporation began discussing uses for the former rocket testing site. Five years ago, with the critical assistance of Saratoga County Government and Senator Joe Bruno, the conversations became more detailed.

Weekly meetings of planners, attorneys, engineers, environmental specialists, and other consultants led to hundreds of other meetings with public officials, town planners and state agencies. In addition to the time, the final environmental studies and the plan for the 1350 acre site were delivered in 2,300 pages of documents. In addition to SEDC, County Government, and National Grid funding, Senator Joe Bruno delivered hundreds of thousands of dollars to the development effort.

Quietly Ken Green, President of SEDC, put locally elected and appointed officials together with their counterparts in other communities with such plants to answer specific questions on everything from safety to impacts on educational institutions.

The five-year ride has not been without hundreds of bumps in the road and pounds of antacid pills to affect the emotional rollercoaster. SEDC has secured the commitment for the construction of a \$500 million first building with over \$2.7 billion of state-of-the-art tech equipment. Full taxes will be paid on the first day the facility opens.

This is only the first industry to locate in the Luther Forest Park with more to follow, to further diversify the County's tax and job base.

What is not widely known is the fact that the vast majority of the incentive package offered AMD is in the way of infrastructure improvements which are normally provided by government.

SEDC has realized its 25 year dream of attracting a premier high tech company that will provide great paying jobs for this and future generations.

Although there are dozens of individuals and organizations to thank, the four which have been at the front of the line since the beginning are: the private sector members of SEDC, Saratoga County Government and Senator Joe Bruno.

DO YOU HAVE STUDENTS ON YOUR HEALTH POLICY ATTENDING COLLEGE? Most insurance policies cover your fulltime college student as a dependent, but require verification of their status. If you've received paperwork from your insurance carrier, return it right away. If not, call member services to provide them with the necessary information to avoid any lapse in coverage for your son or daughter.

HEALTH INSURANCE LEGISLATION Your Chamber joined with Chambers across the state to represent the business view on proposed health insurance legislation. A significant victory was scored for Chamber member sole proprietors in an extension of their special risk pool and a reduction in their monthly premium. Proposals calling for penalties to businesses not offering health insurance to employees were defeated. It was a very serious threat. Although mental health parity with regular health care will most likely pass during the next session of the legislature, businesses with under 50 employees will not realize rate increases because of a small business protection clause.

VETERAN TRAINING FUNDS Employers can pre-qualify future job openings for a special on-the-job training that can pay up to 50% of a new employee's wages for up to 26 weeks. BUSINESS TIP

IDENTITY THEFT

In an effort to reduce the chance of identity theft, Governor Pataki signed a regulation on June 9, 2006 that requires employers to shred, destruct, modify, or take other reasonable action when purging the personal records of employees so that the information cannot be accessed by unauthorized persons. Examples of employee documents that contain personal information include, but are not limited to, application forms, payroll records, and any documents that include social security numbers. An employer that fails to properly dispose of personal employee information can receive a civil penalty of up to \$5,000.

Avoid disaster by updating your personnel recordkeeping policy to address the procedure for purging the personal information of employees. Audit your personnel records to determine if any unnecessary personal information is obtained from applicants and/or employees. For example, do not request social security numbers on application forms.
